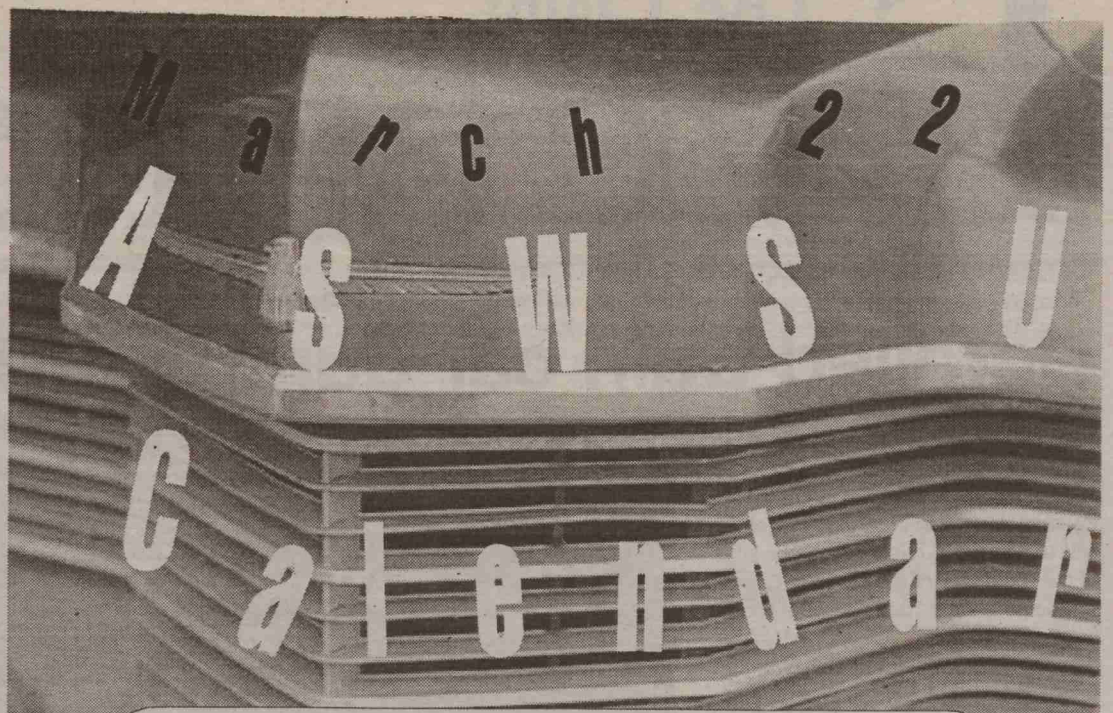
Community Calendar
