First, the school fight song should be printed in the Evergreen.

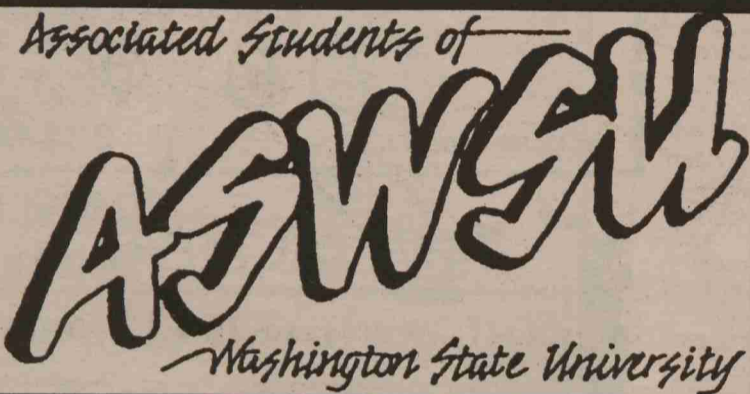
Second, the cheerleaders are great and the fire extinguishers are cute, but how about some pyrotechnics? The AD will rake in some extra cash from the national TV expo-
