Marijuana session today

Marijuana's legal and pharmacological aspects will be the subject of an extended noon-hour discussion today in CUB auditorium from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Tim Ford, lawyer, and Larry Simonsmeier, assistant professor of Pharmacy Law at WSU, will speak and field questions from the audience in this, the second scheduled event of "NORML Days."

"NORML Days" is four days of films, discussions and speeches, sponsored by the WSU chapter of the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws.

NORML President Pete Berney said "NORML Days" is designed to make people aware of how the recreational drugs they use affect them.

Last night, two showings of the

popular films "Reefer Madness" and "Assassins of Youth" kicked off the four-day event.

Tomorrow, Roger Roffman, former state coordinator for NORML and professor of social work at the U of W, will speak at 7 p.m. in the CUB JR. Ballroom.

Thursday, campus police detective Gordon Van Huis and Pullman city policeman Mike Erp will discuss controlled substance laws and ramifications from noon to 1 p.m. on CUB third floor.

NORML Days was made possible through funds from the ASW-SU Political Union. Berney said the program is designed to interest faculty, staff, students and townspeople, and all are welcome at any or all of the events.
