Meetings scheduled

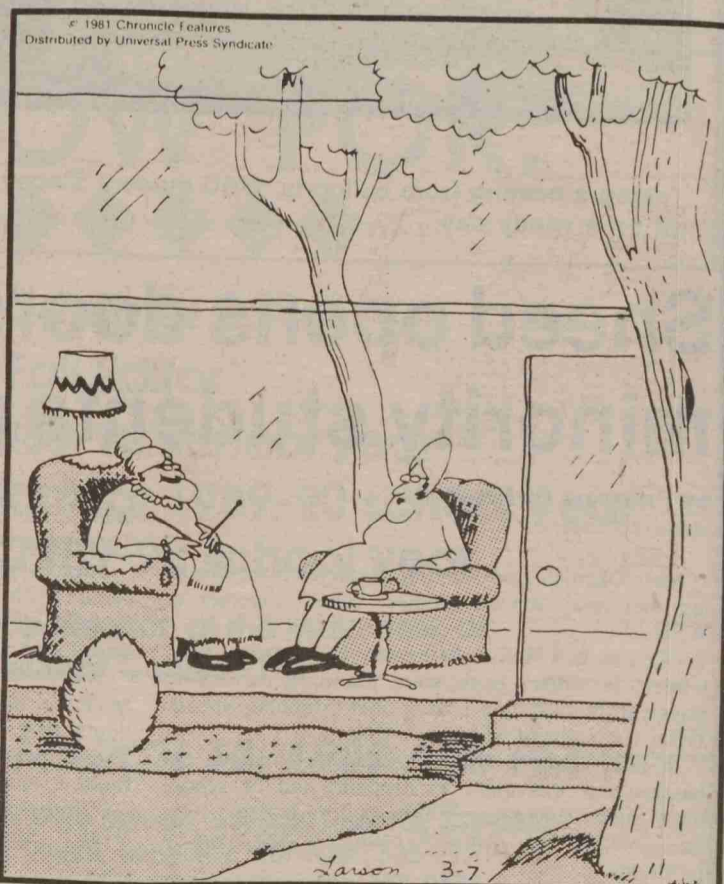
