GLBA serves all students

Doug Hughes claims that gays, as a campus minority, get so much press because "they look white-bread, for the most part."

Sometimes the GLBA seems white; sometimes it doesn't.

During the open forum before the ASWSU Senate, when the GLBA was up for Committee status, most of its members and supporters were white.

On the other hand, in one group of 12 students who drove together to Seattle for the Gay Pride Parade, four

were non-White: A Chinese, a Japanese, a Malaysian and an Ethiopian.

Among those joining the marchers were an African-American, an Indian and an Israeli.

For members of racial and ethnic minorities who also identify as sexual minorities, the risk of ostracism may be greater than for whites.

The GLBA may make it safe for white students, staff and faculty to gather in the program's center on campus, or to stand up and be counted in public forums.

Non-White, non-Christians may

only feel safe associating themselves with the group when the group gathers out of town.

Intolerance is not the sole province of "conservative, party animal, white heterosexuals."

Intolerance, too, comes in all colors.

The GLBA programs serves a population that cuts across all races and ethnicities represented on this campus.
