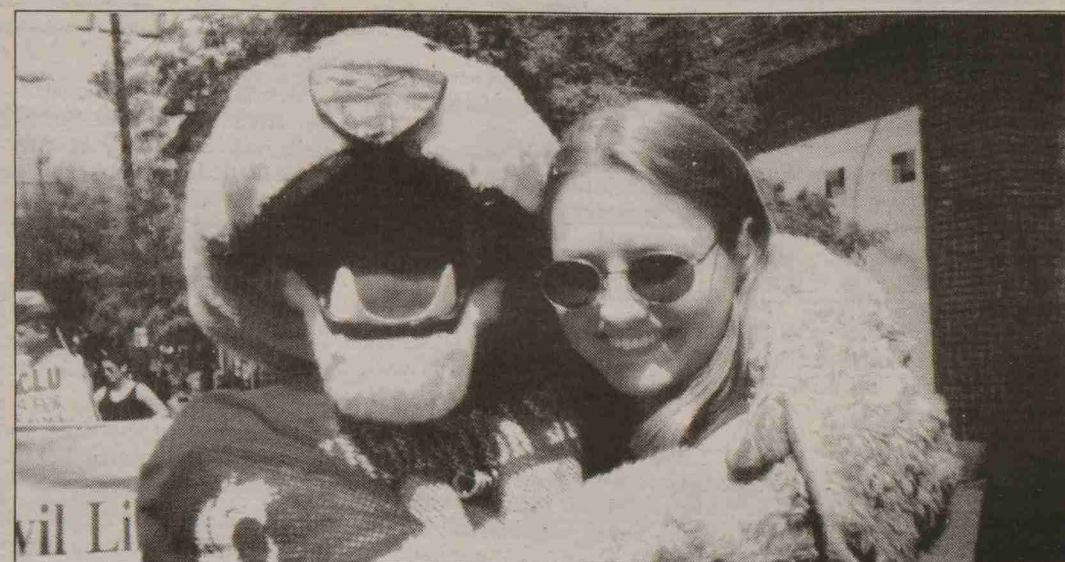

Word and both kinds of computers use it, he said.

"This is the 'wuss' of viruses, but it still causes a lot of headaches," Williams said.

"Many people probably won't notice the virus is there because while saving, the computer looks like it is doing its normal functions," Bennett said.

Microsoft created a virus protection program using a different programming language to override the one the virus took over, he said.

The virus protection program must be installed on every computer individually, Bennett said.

"The problem was inconvenient in the long run, but it didn't do anything to the computers in the lab," he said.

The virus must be manually removed or it will constantly keep writing to itself, Williams said.

To clean the infected document, copy the entire document to the clipboard, delete the infected file, and paste the old document into a new file, he said.

The procedure will eliminate the virus from the document. After closing Microsoft Word, the Word Macro Virus quits, and is eliminated from memory.

"It is a real hassle, but it is the only way to eliminate the virus and save your work," Williams said.

The procedure must be done to each infected document, he said.

Microsoft provides a Scanprot.dot Macro Virus protection tool, which installs protective macros, or series of commands, in the document to detect and warn the user of the virus, according to Scanprot software. The software will not eliminate the virus from the computer; the user has to actually eliminate it.

According to the software directions, Scanprot scanning takes a lot of time and must be installed on one computer at a time.

No program will successfully protect computers from all viruses, Williams said.

"It is a never-ending battle, and people need to be really careful, especially in the computer labs," he said.

"There are literally millions of viruses being created," Williams said. "According to Microsoft there are 20 to 25 new viruses found every day."

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
