'A Taste of Honey' to begin Studio Theatre spring season

A Studio Theater series production of "A Taste of Honey" will open the spring semester productions of University Theatre with performances scheduled tonight, Friday and Saturday.

The play is also scheduled for Feb. 27, 28 and March 1.

Directed by Vernon Poe of Pullman, a graduate student in speech, the play will be presented each night in the Little Theater in Bryan Hall at 8 p.m. Studio Theater productions are directed by graduate students in theater and are primarily experimental, avant garde, and contemporary works.

Written by British playwright,

Shelagh Delaney at 18, the play has been praised by critics for its sensitive portrayal of the three main characters--Jo, a young girl pregnant with her first child; Geoff, the gentle homosexual boy who takes care of Jo; and Helen, Jo's tough and ruthless mother.

The cast includes Cathi Clari, Scottsbluff, Neb., as Jo; Michael D. Rogers, Port Orchard, as Geoff; and Gail Carmichael, Bellevue, as Helen. Jeffrey E. Carrol, Gary, Ind., is cast as Jo's sailor boy friend, and Brian F. Harshman, Pullman, as Helen's latest husband.

Miss Clari appeared in productions at Hiram Scott College and is in the cast of "Twelfth Night," currently being done by the WSU Comedians.

Rogers was seen at Olympic Junior College in various productions and recently was a member of the WSU production, "110 in the Shade."

Miss Carmichael won the National Collegiate Players award for best actress last year.
