ASWSU Entertainment Committees

HOME COMING COMMITTEE: The Homecoming Committee plans and coordinates a week of Homecoming events each year. Past events have included Homecoming Games, competition between living groups, banner and airband contests and a dance.

FILMS COMMITTEE: The Films Committee brings a wide variety of films to campus each weekend at a nominal cost. The selection of films from foreign to recent releases is sure to satisfy the full spectrum of student film tastes.

ENTERTAINMENT COMMITTEE: The Entertainment Committee selects a variety of entertainment for the student body from comedy to concerts.

COFFEEHOUSE COMMITTEE: The Coffeehouse is the place to find local and regional entertainment and talent. It is followed each week by an open mic and free coffee.

ASWSU Service Committees

STUDENT LEGAL SERVICES: Student Legal Services provides students access to free legal consultation service and low-cost council.

HOUSING COMMISSION: The Housing Commission provides current information for off-campus housing and other housing options in Pullman as well as information on landlord/tenant laws. It also operates a roommate referral service.

KZUU FM RADIO BROADCAST COMMITTEE: This committee provides students with a wide range of musical programming. Students may also gain valuable experience by becoming a part of the broadcasting team.

SPORTS FEDERATION: The Sports Federation offers sport programs to students seeking involvement in activities of an athletic nature without the heavy structure of an intercollegiate program.

ASWSU Awareness Committees

ENVIRONMENTAL TASK FORCE: This group promotes environmental awareness through information dissemination and educational programming encompassing local, community, and University concerns, as well as global issues.

LECTURE & PERFORMANCE SERIES: This committee sponsors programs aimed at increasing student awareness of current political issues and student concerns. It encourages student political action through voter registration and information programs.

GLBA: The mission of the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Allies Program (GLBAP) is to assist Washington State University in providing an environment and in creating a climate that acknowledges, respects and enhances diversity for its student population.

VETERAN'S AFFAIRS: The Veteran's Affairs Committee builds awareness of issues relating to Veterans. It also provides a peer group on campus.

WASHINGTON STATE INTERCOLLEGIATE STATE LEGISLATURE (WISL): This group educates students in the legislative process through hands-on experience in a statewide student legislative session.

Multicultural Student Committees

ASIAN PACIFIC AMERICAN STUDENTS COMMITTEE: The APASC Committee's goal is to increase cultural awareness of WSU students. Past programs sponsored by APASC have included a cultural movie series, guest speakers, as well as guest artists and performers. This committee is open to all students on campus.

AFRICAN AMERICAN ASSOCIATION: The African American Association promotes political and social unity among African American people and those of African American heritage. Two annual events include a fashion show and the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Candlelight March in January. Membership is open to all students on campus.

KU-AU-MAH: This committee sponsors events that provide recognition of Native American cultures, traditions, concerns, and issues. Ku-Au-Mah's annual cultural event is a Pow Wow held each spring. This event features drummers and dancers from all over the northwest. Membership is open to all students on campus.

MEChA: This is a Chicano/Latino student organization. MEChA sponsors events concerning Chicano/Latino issues. Past MEChA programs have included speakers, an awards banquet, and delegation to the MEChA National Conference. Membership is open to all students on campus.
