"We haven't had anything bomb yet," Buskala said. But Earle added that the center's funding has faced strong conservative Christian opposition.

The UW's Gay Men's and Lesbian's Association does not receive anything near what the gay groups at Western and Evergreen are allocated by the students.

Glen Furta, vice president of finance for ASUW, said the Gay Men's and Lesbian's Association, an independent organization, is allocated about \$200 per quarter (\$600 a year) by the ASUW Board of Control to put on a dance for gays and lesbians every quarter.

THE ASUW WILL FUND programs sponsored by student groups, but won't fund groups for such things as office supplies, telephones, etc., Furta said.

Furta said the board of control has never turned down a Gay Men's and Lesbian's Association request for money because the gay group's dances have been "successful. We don't look at their philosophy, religious orientation or sexual preference — we just judge on merits."

On the east side of the Cascades, student gay groups at Eastern Washington University and this university plan on fighting for student funds to promote awareness of gay issues, while the gay group at Central Washington University is dead in the water.

Eastern's Gayla — the Gay and Lesbian Alliance — has been resurrected during the past couple of years and plans on asking for student funds this year, according to Darren Henke, financial vice president for the ASEWU.

During the fall quarter, the Gayla was recognized as a student club and organization, which makes it eligible to ask for student funds from the ASEWU finance committee this spring, Henke said.

Since the Gayla has never been allocated student funds, he said, "It's a pretty touchy issue."

IN ELLENSBURG, Pat Moore, scheduling manager for Central Washington University, says the Central Gay Alliance, a student club, has not been allocated student funds for this school year. The ASCWU only will fund the club's programs, he added.

The Central Gay Alliance and other student clubs were allocated by the ASCWU at most \$30 per year, but the ASCWU discontinued these allocations because of budget cuts five years ago, Moore said.

"CWU's (Gay Alliance) really had a tough time, too. It's a real red neck area," Buskala said.
