District 3: All ASWSU members residing in Phi Sigma Kappa, <u>Delta Upsilon</u>, Phi Kappa Theta, Phi Gamma Delta, Farmhouse, Phi Delta Theta, <u>Acacia</u>, Tau Kappa Epsilon, <u>Kappa Delta</u>, <u>Delta Chi</u>, Gamma Phi Beta, <u>Sigma Nu</u>, <u>Alpha Chi Omega</u>, & Sigma Phi Epsilon.

A number of changes have been made to allow candidates for ASWSU Executive and candidates for At Large and Off Campus Senate to campaign and display campaign materials in additional locations. Among these changes are:

The above candidates may address student organizational meetings which take place in academic buildings and may post campaign materials on general use bulletin boards in these buildings.

The above candidates may display billboards on the west lawn of Holland Library, subject to the size and design restrictions.

The above candidates may display banners on the CUB and on designated fencing, subject to size and design restrictions.

All candidates may campaign using WSU Computing Systems as long as they do so in an appropriate manner. Candidates are referred to WSU Computing Systems and Computing Publication U-015 and certain usages are specifically prohibited.
