fraternity, Rogers said.

He said although Cloud wasn't an uptight person and he never saw him lose his temper, "he always wanted to have a good time when he drank — it didn't matter what the consequences were," he added, reflecting on Cloud's dismissal from the fraternity.

Dan Thumlert, a former pledge brother of Cloud, said: "Darrell had a wild temper. But this is something I never would have imagined he was capable of — unless he was provoked."

Cloud, who was an outstanding quarterback at Juanita High School, led his teammates to a state championship in 1986. The following year, he came to WSU as a walk-on and played one year for the Cougars.

Rogers, a friend of the Cloud family, said Cloud left WSU because of academic deficiency. Afterward, he went to Green River Community College, where he set the single-season home run record for the college.

"He was an athlete," Rogers said. "He also played baseball for two years at the UW."

Although the case will be pending for months, the people who know Cloud say they will be waiting for answers.

"I keep expecting to turn on the TV and see a big story on 'A Current Affair,'" Thumlert said. "It's unfair what the press will do to the Cloud family in the upcoming months."

This may be an opportune time for GLBA to assert itself. With two anti-gay rights initiatives under consideration, the group is in a position to support opposition of the initiatives. McGrath says because he is from out of state, he is not as schooled on the particular initiatives as he probably should be. He said his group has, and will continue to act on such initiatives primarily by writing legislators.

He also said the GLBA is not ready to take any more serious action. The new group is still going through an adjustment process which includes learning to be vocal.

"Anything we do has to be kept quiet," McGrath said. "No one from the organization would be willing to stand up and say 'I'm for gay rights; I don't think the opportunity is there to be open about it on this campus.'"

The GLBA also has a dance scheduled for March 25 in Butch's Den in the CUB. There is a support line in operation for gays and lesbians Monday through Thursday, from 7-8 p.m., at 335-4311.


