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Goldsboro hurries. but act amusing

How does one keep vitality and relevance in an act continuing

for almost 15 years?
Bobby Goldsboro and Mike Neun presented a relaxed evening of entertainment to an appreciative Dad's Weekend aggregation Saturday night in the Coli-

That Goldsboro would have had a difficult time filling Todd 444, let alone the Coliseum, had it not been Dad's Weekend is an understatement. It is also unfortunate. He provided a contrast to force-

ful, demanding acts. Goldsboro, despite his Las Vegas trappings — the two chesty background vocalists and his uniformed band — is a sensitive songwriter, seemingly uncomfortable Saturday with the stage set-up. Realizing he was before a college audience, Goldsboro appeared nervous, hurrying his anecdotes - many of which were amusing and would have been more so had he not rushed them.

Goldsboro's soft baritone covered many of his hits — "Honey," "Watchin' Scotty Grow" and "I'm a Drifter" plus a medley of some of his older tunes which, in the days of the Beatles were among the only American errorts to make the dience into the most difficult national charts.

Songs such as "Little Things," "See the Funny Little Clown" and "It's Too Late" in the mid'60s established Goldsboro as a rock 'n' roller in the ilk of a Roy Orbison, with whom Goldsboro once worked.

Though it took a while, Goldsboro won over the audience and though he forgot the words to an encore request, the audience forgave him with their applause. He apologized and asked to do another but the keyboardist, who also doubled as the obnoxious voice introducing Goldsboro, told him to go into theme music ending the show. Goldsboro should have told the gentleman to tie an extension cord around his throat and plug it in.

Goldsboro would have been more effective if he, like opener Mike Neun, had performed in a more austere setting. Neun charmed the audience with his light wit and easy guitar and harmonica playing.

His comments on subjects as diverse as Howard Cosell ("An air bag in his car would be redun-dant."), hunting("Loved the killing, hated the camaraderie and the tramping through the woods'') and Anita Bryant (''Wouldn't it be funny if they found out orange juice caused homosexuality?") kept the crowd chuckling throughout his

He was able to coax the ausing-alongs this pen has ever heard and seemed genuinely surprised to be called back for an encore.
