Pullman voters give nod to levy

Pullman voters approved this year's \$1,250,000 school levy with 77 percent yes votes, Ray Smith, superintendent of schools said.

Of the 2,039 voting on the levy, 1,558 voted for and 481 against.

The levy, for maintenance and operation, will be about \$3.17 per \$1,000 of the new assessed evaluation of property within the school district. The property was recently reassessed at \$400 million, more than double the previous assessment of \$197 million, Smith said.

The levy will pay for 25 percent of the school district's \$5 million budget, Smith said. The rest of the money will come mostly from state funds, with some coming from federal and other sources.

The school levy has not failed in Pullman for some time, Smith said. It failed on the first try in 1973, but was passed the second

The percentage of yes votes seen now is not unusually high for this area, Smith said. Last year, the levy passed with 85 percent yes votes. Other districts in the area had even higher percentages of yes votes.

"This shows evidence of community concern," Smith said. "People do value education here and continue to support it.

"Groups that request maximum utilization of the beds available have priority of assignment over those who do not," explained Wiggins.

Wiggins said assignment of apartments will be made before students leave the campus in June. Also, "Students will be notified if they are on a waiting list and not assigned to a unit so that they may have time to find other places to live.'

He said those groups who receive an apartment assignment, and decide later to cancel, will receive their full security deposit if they notify Housing and Food Service, in writing, before June 1. Those who cancel after June 1 and before August 15 will lose \$10 for administration handling fee. Groups will lose their entire deposit if the rental agreement is cancelled after

Wiggins explained all continuing groups will receive an application and rental agreement. If the current tenants return their applications to the Housing and Food Service office no later than May 7, they have first priority over all new groups.

Wiggins said if a student plans to join a continuing group now in an apartment, he should send in his application and rental agreement with the continuing group.
