Alumnus to lecture


James Booth, cited "for highest achievement in the discovery of the antibiotics tetracycline and minocycline," will lecture today at 4 p.m. in Wegner Hall G-50 about "Antibiotics-Their History and Development."

Booth, a 1939 WSU honors graduate in pharmacy, has devoted nearly four decades to studies of anti-tumor agents and antibiotics, and has received the WSU Alumni Achievement Award.

The Okanogan native was a teaching assistant and a Lederle Research Fellow at the University of Minnesota where he earned a Ph.D in Pharmaceutical Chemistry in 1943.

Booth has lectured widely in the U.S. and abroad, holds more than 50 patents, and is the author of more than 50 scientific papers. The scientist will also lecture tomorrow at noon on "Recent Developments in


