## Jazz trumpeter to perform

Allen Vizzutti, one of the nation's top jazz trumpeters, will perform at 8 p.m. March 26 in Bryan Auditorium.

Vizzutti will be the featured soloist with the university jazz ensemble and the Northwest Big Band. During his stay, he will also address the jazz improvisation and jazz history classes and give trumpet clinics.

He is the lead trumpet player for

Chick Corea's band, and has previously served as Woody Herman's lead player. He also has his own solo album out.

The concert is sponsored by the Northwest Chapter of the International Trumpet Guild and is made possible by an Arts and Sciences visiting lecturer grant and by the university committee in visual, literary, and performing arts.

## Alumnus to lecture

James Booth, cited "for highest achievement in the discovery of the antibiotics tetracycline and minocycline," will lecture today at 4 p.m. in Wegner Hall G-50 about "Antibiotics—Their History and Development."

Booth, a 1939 WSU honors graduate in pharmacy, has devoted nearly four decades to studies of anti-tumor agents and antibiotics, and has received the WSU Alumni Achievement Award.

The Okanogan native was a teaching assistant and a Lederle Research Fellow at the University of Minnesota where he earned a Ph.D in Pharmaceutical Chemistry in 1943.

Booth has lectured widely in the U.S. and abroad, holds more than 50 patents, and is the author of more than 50 scientific papers.

The scientist will also lecture tomorrow at noon on "Recent Developments in Beta-Lactam Antibiotics."
