I am not a student at WSU so the issue of funding Gay Awareness does not directly affect me. However, I do live and work in Pullman

Within the past few weeks I have been shocked and sickened by the prevailing attitude on campus toward homosexuals. For example, several days ago I was sitting in a public restaurant with a friend of mine. He was approached by a group of males who picked up his glass of water, poured it on him and cursed him for no reason except he was sitting there and he is gay

Another friend of mine was merely walking to class when he was attacked by a group who threw water balloons at him and shouted obscenities-mocking him because he is gay. (Refer to previous letter written by Dennis Moore.)

There are many examles-debris and obscenities thrown at gay people trom passing cars, obscene gestures and derogatory names from passing students, etc.

One incident was directed at me, although I am not gay. I was walking home along Greek Row, when I was passed by two sorority coeds who assumed I was gay because of my attire. They linked arms and loudly invited me to a "lesbian party" at their sorority house. I did not feel it m time and energy to explain to these people that my job requires that I dress in a less than "feminine" manner.

I have seen some of the more unprintable letters received by the Evergreen and read most of those printed and I cannot believe they were written by intelligent, thinking people.

All of the gay people I have ever been acquainted with are gentle, intelligent men and women who have done nothing to warrant such attacks. Yet, if the perpetrators of the acts were ever to be attacked by a gay person I'm sure the campus police would never hear the end of it. Do these people really find it necessary to resort to such vicious, childish actions to show their ignorance???

Gay Awareness has spent much time, money and energy to educate students on the alternative, homosexual lifestyle by lecturing in classes and bringing in speakers and films. All of these activities are geared toward informing students that gays are not "mindless perverts" waiting to rape or otherwise force people into their lifestyle.

Any funds going to Gay Awareness are not being used to pur-chase "cases of vasoline" (as one woman suggested) or for gay social functions. That is as ridiculous as suggesting that the money the Greeks raise goes for beer and condoms.
