

Hunger Awareness' status tabled

The ASWSU Assembly last night tabled until next week a motion to consider the Hunger Awareness Task Force as an ASWSU committee.

The assembly also voted to increase the Mayfest Committee's financial speculation to \$5,000 from the original \$2,000

Hunger Task Force representative Bob Loomis said the group would like to have committee

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status so it could be "more effective

The assembly asked Loomis to talk with the chairman of the Environmental Task Force about becoming a subcommittee of that group because the task force's goals are not just educational.

Providing charity to needy countries and peoples are among the groups' goals, Loomis said Activities adviser David Lee said it might be a problem to supply state funds to charity

Assembly member Karen Sticklin told Loomis the assembly could accept the task force if its objectives were completely educational, but it cannot now because some of its motives are charitable.

The Mayfest Committee's speculation, or money it will be expected to return to ASWSU. was raised from \$2,000 to \$5,000 at the request of the Mayfest Committee

Mayfest co-chairperson Terri Robson told the assembly Mayfest needed more money so it will be able to book performers and groups for the week-long activity.

That motion was passed with the stiuplation that it be reconsidered next week.

Lee said he "trusts Mayfest to bring in \$5,000.'

If the \$5,000 is not met by the committee, ASWSU will be responsible for the money.

A special ski day at North-South Ski Bowl was unanimously approved by the assembly. The ski day will be held March 18 with a special lift-ticket price for the general public.

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
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Palouse Area Singles Group will meet today from 4:30 to p.m. for happy hour at Holly's Restaurant.

Spurs reports the entry deadline for Songfest is tomorrow.


