And students are taking advantage of the program.

"We all get along really well," said Nicole Winn, an resident adviser for a pre-nursing floor in Goldsworthy Hall.

She said there have been no big problems, but a few of the parents were not informed their sons and daughters were living on mixed-sex floors, so it was a bit of a shock to them when they came to visit, Winn said.

"Bathrooms are not a problem," she said. "The girls have their bathroom at one end of the hall, and the guys at the other end."




