The "Who put these fences here?" award to the people who still cut across the Holland Library lawn.

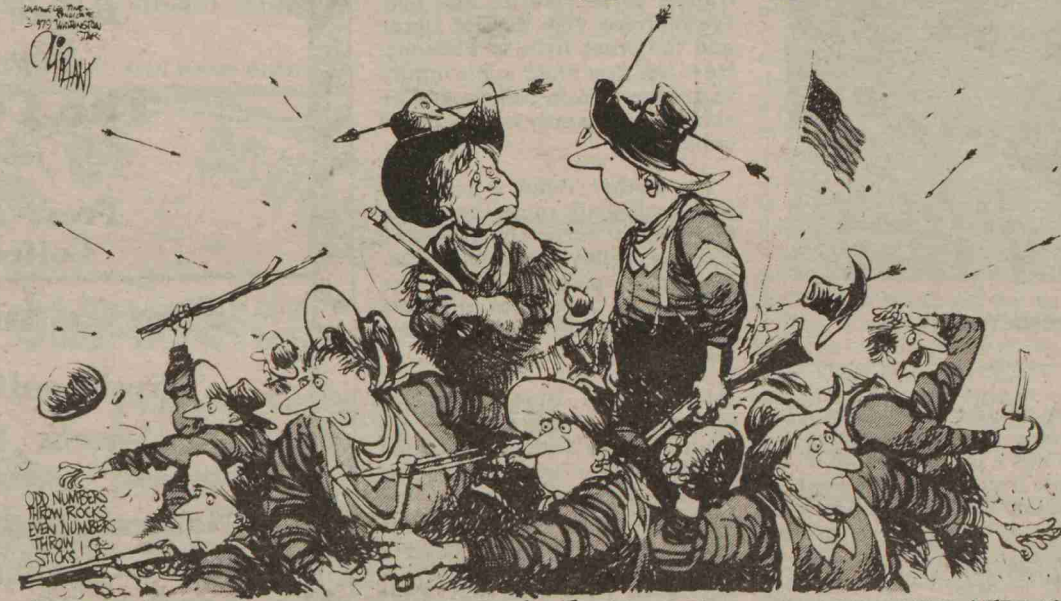
The "This book is worthless, you bozo" award goes to those friendly book buy-back people in the Bookie.

The "Mud Hut Beautiful" award goes to the Bank that Dexter Horton built, over one hundred years ago.

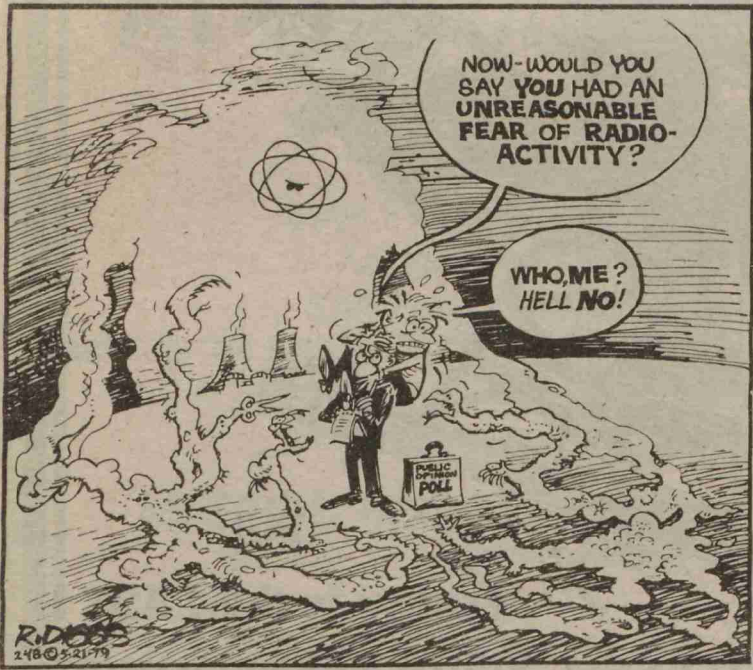
The "Why didn't someone think of this before?" award goes to the Bookie and Mother's Cupboard for their "penny pools."

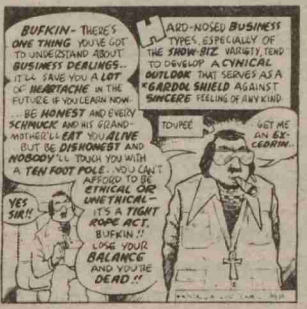
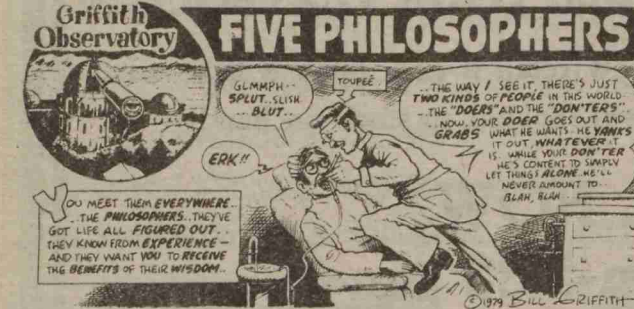
