Amazing coup d'etat

Gays get \$7.5 million while ASWSU fumes

After becoming the first student group to lose ASWSU financial support through a student election last year, the Gay Awareness Committee has turned the tables on its former parent organization by denying it funding or formal recognition.

Thanks to a \$7.5 million grant from the Florida Orange Growers Trust Corporation, this year's GAC budget soared to al-

most 14 times ASWSU's 1979-80 budget. And because of bad feelings generated by the landslide defeat of the GAC's telephone allocation request, the rejuvenated organization will not offer any financial aid to ASWSU.

ASWSU was gravely weakened this summer by a \$250,000 withdrawal of money by the Board of Regents and University President Glenn Terrible to build a track at the former site of the baseball field, and a new baseball

field at the proposed new track site.

"Now the gays have more money than we do and they won't give us any," whined ASWSU President Barry Gaker.

The \$7.5 million grant, which GAC received this summer, was given because "Washington is about as far away from Florida as you can get," an orange grower said.

Although half of the grant will be used as GAC sees fit, the other half will go into research on developing a homosexual vaccination and "sending them back where they came from," according to publicity releases.

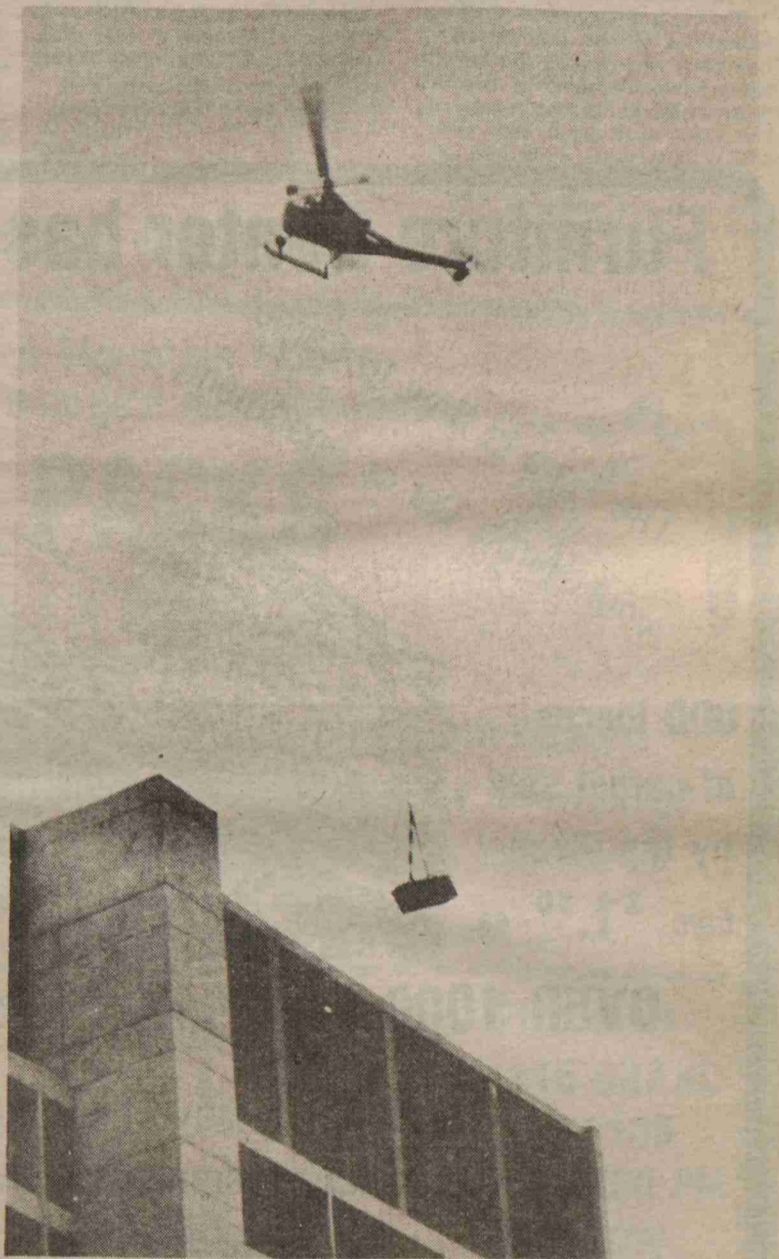
Also planned are experimental "Gaylabs," orbiting space stations built specifically to house homosexuals above the earth's atmosphere until they "run out of gas and burn up on reentry."

Most of the GAC-controlled funds will be used to harass "straights" and indoctrinate healthy children into the "homosexual lifestyle." Also, a group of former motorcycle gang members will be recruited as "straight-bashers," pummeling any avowed heterosexual to within an inch of his or her life if he or she does not conform.

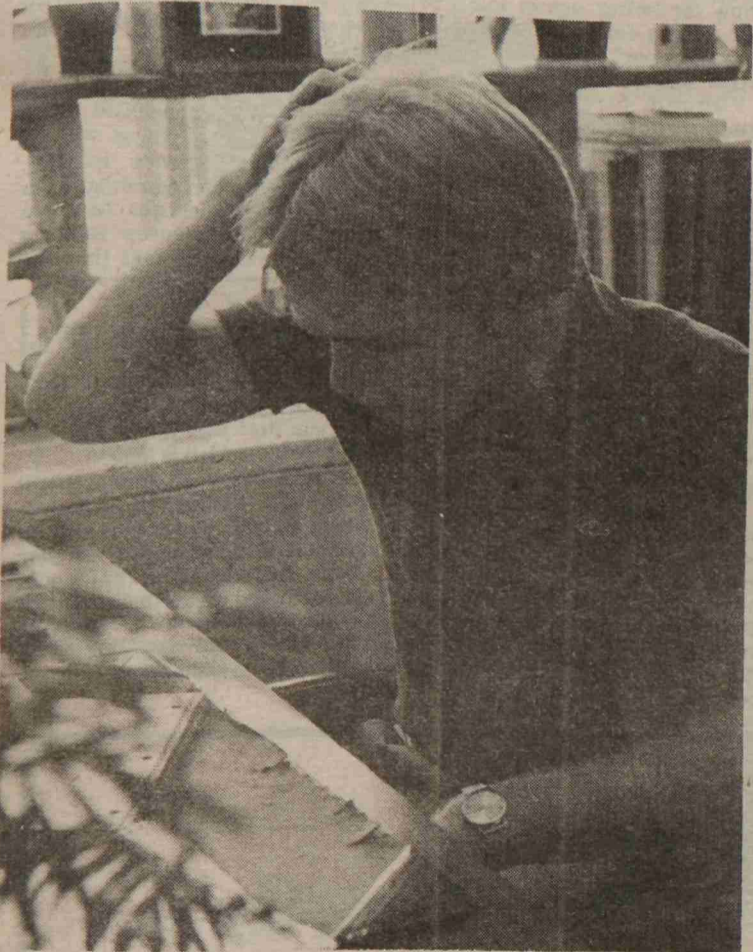
Programs will be available to Pullman Youth groups, the Camp Fire Girls, the Girl Scouts, Brownies and Boy Scouts.

But the weakened ASWSU will not take this bending over, vowed Gaker. "We plan to stop this violation and fight every inch. First, we plan on betting half of our remaining budget on the daily double at the Playfair next weekend. If that doesn't work, we might schedule a student government conference in Las Vegas, catch a few shows, and plug the rest of the money into the dollar slot machines and crap tables."

The source of conflict between the general student population and GAC centered around allocation of about \$110 for telephone services. Now, GAC has over 40 telephones in its CUB offices

with plans to buy over 20 more. "We're not spending money frivolously, we're just rubbing the students' noses in our newly gained fortune," a spokesman said.

In fact, the only way GAC will renew ties with ASWSU is to have ASWSU join the gay organization, he said. "Even then, they'd have to explain every little expenditure. We don't want some deviants getting into our organization and setting things straight," he said.

Gaker angrily denied ASWSU would join up with GAC. "If those bums think I'll come crawling to them on my hands and

knees to beg for a handout, they've got another thing coming," said Gaker as he sold pencils outside the CUB.
